# Challenge

With CMMC 2.0 compliance becoming mandatory for DoD contractors, the company needed an independent cybersecurity assessment to evaluate its existing security framework and ensure alignment with NIST 800-171 standards. Without a formalized cybersecurity program, the company was unable to document all 110 security controls, monitor compliance, and mitigate potential vulnerabilities. To avoid risks such as contract non-compliance, security deficiencies, and competitive disadvantages, its IT staff needed expert guidance to identify gaps, establish structured security policies, and implement improvements to ensure long-term compliance and operational resilience.

# Solution
